National Partnership payments for infrastructure

The Australian Government provides National Partnership payments to the states for infrastructure, as detailed below.

Infrastructure Investment Program

The Australian Government provides funding to the states, territories and local governments for road and rail infrastructure through the Infrastructure Investment Program under the Federation Funding Agreement Schedule on Land Transport Infrastructure Projects. The Australian Government has a ten-year funding allocation for this program.

The Infrastructure Investment Program assists economic and social development regionally and nationally by providing funding to deliver land transport infrastructure.

In November 2023, the Australian Government released its Infrastructure Policy Statement setting out the three strategic themes of productivity and resilience, liveability and sustainability to guide its future investment decisions.

The Government works with states, territories and local governments to prioritise the delivery of projects in line with market capacity.

More information is available in Budget Paper No. 1, *Budget Strategy and Outlook 2026–27, Statement 1: Budget Overview*.

A portion of Australian Government funding for road infrastructure is sourced from the additional net revenue received from the reintroduction of fuel excise indexation in 2014.
